### Preparation for Worship

“Worthy are You to take the book and to break its seals; for You were slain, and purchased for God with Your blood men from every tribe and tongue and people and nation. You have made them to be a kingdom and priests to our God; and they will reign upon the earth.”

Revelation 5:9-10

#### Key points from the verse:

- Jesus’ worthiness is rooted in His sacrificial death
- He purchased a people, redeeming by His blood people from every tribe, tongue, and nation
- He not only saves us, but He made us a Kingdom and Priests, giving us a new identity and purpose: to serve and reign with Him

#### Suggestions for Prayer

- Gratitude for the Cross: Praise Jesus that He is the Lamb who was slain to redeem us by His blood
- Live out our Identity: That we would worship as His redeemed people; a Kingdom of priests called to serve Him
- Worldwide Worship: Give us hearts that long to see all nations come to worship Him

Officiant: I will extol You, O LORD, for You have lifted me up and have not let my enemies rejoice over me.

Congregation: O LORD my God, I cried to You for help, and You healed me.  
O LORD, You have brought up my soul from Sheol.

Officiant: You have kept me alive, that I would not go down to the pit. Sing Praise to the LORD, you His godly ones,

Congregation: And give thanks to His holy name.

GOD CLEANSSES US WITH THE BLOOD OF CHRIST

Confession of Sin

Congregation: O LORD, do not rebuke us in Your anger, or discipline us in Your wrath. For Your arrows have sunk into us, and Your hand has come down on us. There is no soundness in our flesh because of Your indignation; there is no health in our bones because of our sin. For our iniquities have gone over our heads; they weigh like burdens too heavy for us. Forgive our sins, pardon our iniquities, and restore our communion with You, we ask through our Blessed Lord Jesus, Who for a little while was made lower than the angels, and is now crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, Who by Your grace tasted death for all who are in Him. Amen. [Based upon Ps. 38 and Heb. 3]

Confession of Faith Westminster Shorter Catechism Q27

Wherein did Christ’s humiliation consist?

Christ’s humiliation consisted in His being born, and that in a low condition, made under the law, undergoing the miseries of this life, the wrath of God, and the cursed death of the cross; in being buried, and continuing under the power of death for a time.
